Some Qualifying Circumstances

Can include, but are not limited to:

- Low income
- High school drop-out
- Basic skills deficient
- Pregnant and/or parenting (including males)
- Homeless, runaway, or foster
- Ex-offenders
- Young Adults with disabilities
- Young Adults in need of assistance in order to complete an education or training program



Training Opportunities
