

Economic Growth Region 2

Statistical Data Report for January 2022, Released March 2022

State Employment and Unemployment

Unemployment rates were lower in January in 19 states, higher in 2 states and the District of Columbia, and stable in 29 states, the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics reported. Forty-nine states and the District had jobless rate decreases from a year earlier and one state was little changed. Nebraska and Utah had the lowest jobless rates in January, 2.2 percent each. The next lowest rates were in Indiana, 2.4 percent, and Kansas, 2.6 percent. The rates in these four states set new series lows, as did the rates in the following six states (all state series begin in 1976): Arkansas (3.2 percent), Georgia (3.2 percent), Mississippi (4.6 percent), Montana (2.7 percent), Oklahoma (2.7 percent), and West Virginia (4.1 percent). The District of Columbia had the highest unemployment rate, 6.3 percent, followed by New Mexico, 5.9 percent, and California, 5.8 percent. The national unemployment rate, 4.0 percent, was little changed over the month, but was 2.4 percentage points lower than in January 2021.

Nonfarm payroll employment increased in 9 states and was essentially unchanged in 41 states and the District of Columbia in January 2022. Over the year, nonfarm payroll employment increased in 46 states and the District and was essentially unchanged in 4 states.






Elkhart-Goshen MSA Employment Trends


